Feds: Bennett is cleared in billing probe

Ex-state Senate leader 'not target' of federal investigation

Former state Sen. John O. Bennett III, once the state's top Republican who lost re-election amid questions about his dealings in Mariboro, is "not a target" of a federal grand jury probe into legal bills he submitted to the municipality, according to a letter from a federal prosecutor.

The March 14 letter from the U.S. Attorney for New Jersey comes four years after Bennett asked the county prosecutor to investigate his dealings with a township developer, who was later indicted on a myriad of federal charges.

The letter, signed by Assistant U.S. Attorney James B. Nobile, told Ben-

nett's attorney that "in connection with a grand jury investigation regarding Marlboro Township professional billing matters, please be advised that John Bennett, III is not a target of this grand jury investigation."

Nobile defined a target as someone the grand jury has substantial criminal evidence against.
