Despite its name, the Henry Hudson Trail is used for more than just recreational activities — it is used as a safe route for residents to travel along New Jersey State Route 36. Many parts of the Trail provide the only sidewalks for people to safely walk to public transportation, grocery stores and local pharmacies.

If the Henry Hudson Trail continues to remain closed under your directive, the residents of Middletown and those who use it to commute to work and other activities will have no choice but to walk along a State Highway undoubtedly putting them in harm's way. Furthermore, I struggle to understand how marinas are classified as essential for recreational purposes but a multi-use trail along a State Highway remains closed.
